Thank you for all that you do at the school Mr. Jack and for always remembering the people in our community that have given so much!



While Grade 8s were at Camp, students in Grades 9 & 10 were engaged in the Career Conferences for two days, covering both the Curricula and Core Competencies for this important 8-12 program that culminates in the Grade 12 Capstone Program.



Here is a summary of the key presentations form the conferences:

Career Zone/Volunteering in the Community/VSB Career Programs

Career Zone is an organization that help youth with their cover letters, resumes and find jobs. Dunbar Community Centre's Youth Coordinator will be coming to talk about ways to get involved in the community through volunteering. The VSB offers several different District Career Programs that our students can participate in.

Jack.org (Fiona Mak and Olivia Lipton)

Jack.org is a charity that trains and empowers youth who are revolutionizing mental health. They are working towards a Canada where all young people understand how to take care of their own mental health and look out for each other. A Canada without shame, and where all those that need support, get the help they deserve. With a national network of thousands of young leaders, they're only just getting started. Two of those leaders are joining us today:

Fiona Mak: Fiona Mak is in her first year at Capilano University and is planning to study early childhood education and child development to work towards becoming a child life specialist. Fiona is excited to be combining two of her loves: talking and advocating for stigma free discussions about mental health all in the hopes of inspiring other young people to do the same. You'll find Fiona hanging out with her dog, drinking fizzy water and talking about Chris Hadfield to whoever will listen. Olivia Lipton: Olivia Lipton is a third year Social Work student at the University of British Columbia. She is excited to be a Jack Talks Speaker as she is passionate about mental health, well-being, youth, and giving back to her community. In her spare time, she can be found volunteering for Sending Sunshine, being a on the Leadership Summit Animation Team for YWCA's Think Now! Lead Big! Program, attending Jack.org Summits, hiking, travelling, or spending time with family and friends.

Kevin Brooks

Motivational speaker, talks about healthy decision making, and the impacts of his choice of driving intoxicated, distracted and at excessive speeds with a fearless attitude of "it will never happen to me"

Safer School Together

Social Media Awareness, Digital Footprints, and Cyberbullying

This presentation will cover all things digital, from digital citizenship and how to be a good digital citizen to the criminal consequences of cyberbullying. Some of the most prominent concerns currently surrounding student's use of social networking sites and smartphones will be discussed. Topics covered will include: how to practice netiquette (online etiquette), how to recognize and respond to cyberbullying, the criminal and social consequences of cyberbullying behaviour and the possession and distribution of intimate images (sexting), self/peer exploitation, digital media habits and oversharing, digital addiction, piracy and plagiarism. At this stage in their school career they hopefully should be very familiar with their digital footprint online and how this is a representation of their real and online selves. Everything they post online will be public, permanent, and searchable. This is now more important than ever, and we know that university and college admissions staff as well as prospective employers are now researching applicants' online lives before they even consider a resume or transcript. Social media should be a platform for students to showcase their interests, skills, and accomplishments. Real world examples will be shown of the detrimental effect that social media and online behaviour has had youth moving forward with their lives. The illusion of anonymity online will be spoken to in cautioning students from misrepresenting themselves online and creating false profiles. Geo-locational settings will be covered, as well as the dangers of social media and cell phone misuse. Finally, a discussion of personal media habits will engage the audience and prompt them to reflect on their own digital lives and how it is affecting them.
