## SAFE ARRIVAL - STUDENT ATTENDANCE



We will continue to use the district Safe Arrival line to report student absences. You may do this 24/7. Please call (604) 713-5426, and press 1 for Safe Arrival (there is a prompt). You will then leave a message. It is vital that all absences are called into the school prior to 9am. Please, speak clearly, leave your child's name, spelling of last name, division, day(s) and reason for absence.

# STUDENTS ARRIVING LATE TO SCHOOL OR LEAVING EARLY

It is very important that students are accounted for. If your child arrives to school late, they should check in at the office and then go to class. It is also important that students leaving the school prior to 3pm on a given day are signed out. Since the school building is currently restricted to students and staff, please let the classroom teacher know. When you are about to arrive or have just arrived at the school, please come to the front door and ring the doorbell, or call the office, and a staff member will release your child to you. We need to physically see that they go with their parent/guardian.

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# How to tell if it's bullying

Not all unkind or hurtful behaviour is bullying. Here's how to tell the difference.



# Bullying is different from conflict or unkindness

- It's normal to argue or have conflict with others
- Not all conflict, fighting or arguing is bullying
- Someone can be rude or mean and it doesn't make them a bully
- Both bullying and unkindness can be upsetting and hurtful

# Rude, mean or bullying?

### Here's what they all mean:

### Rude

Saying or doing something hurtful that wasn't planned or meant to upset someone.

# Mean

Saying or doing something hurtful to someone on purpose once or twice.

### **Bullying**

Someone more powerful saying or doing something hurtful to someone on purpose, over and over again.
