COVID NEWS/UPDATES

- Some Covid restrictions have been eased at school including the follow:
 - No specific capacity limit for school gatherings and events that bring together multiple classes or other groupings of students
 - Indoor capacity should not exceed 50 people or 50% of operating capacity (whichever is greater) for school performance and sports events
 - Spectators (e.g., parents, caregivers, peers), may be present for gatherings and events within capacity limits.
 {a maximum of 50 people or 50% the capacity of the designated spectators' area, whichever is greater}
 - NO CHANGE: Daily Health Check, hand hygiene and mask wearing at school
- Visitors are no longer limited to those supporting activities of direct benefit to student learning and wellbeing. Parents can visit school but appointments are required. Parents and visitors must sign in at the school office.
- The BC Government has supplied COVID-19 Rapid Test Kits for students and their families. Each student will receive one (1) box containing five test kits. The test kits could arrive at school sites anytime over the next couple of weeks. I will inform parents once the test kits are ready to be sent home.
- Please continue to dress students warmly so they will be comfortable when they go out for recess and lunch.
 Rain boots and waterproof coats are highly recommended on rainy days to keep students comfortable outside.
- And please remember to keep social distance from other students when dropping off and picking up your child at school. Parents are not members of their child's learning groups.

INTERNATIONAL TRAVEL:	WHAT TO DO	
Have you returned from travel outside Canada in the last 14 days?	If yes: Fully vaccinated students, staff and other adults who have travelled outside of Canada may qualify for the fully vaccinated traveller exemption. Students, staff and other adults who are not fully vaccinated and have travelled outside of Canada CANNOT attend school for 14 days after arrival, as part of federal requirements.	
CLOSE CONTACT	WHAT TO DO	
Have you been notified by public health that you are a close contact of a person confirmed to have COVID-19?	If yes: Follow the instructions provided by Public Health.	

You can also check your symptoms with the K-12 Health Check or the BC Self-Assessment Tool.

Call 8-1-1 with any questions about symptoms of illness. If you have severe symptoms, like difficulty breathing (struggling to breathe or you can only speak single words) or chest pain, call 9-1-1 or go to the nearest Emergency Department.
