- 1. Call to Order, Welcome, and Land Acknowledgement 6:35 p.m.
- 2. Additions and Approval of Agenda M/S/C
- 3. Approval of Minutes from October 20, 2021 meeting M/S/C
- 4. Business Arising from Last Meeting
 - a. Vacant Board Positions: Treasurer/Co-treasurer, Vice Chair, Secretary, Member at Large: Co-Fundraising Coordinator – Mike
 - If anyone is interested in the vacant board position, please reach out to the PAC.
 - b. Pumpkins Mike/Nur
 - Pumpkins were purchased by Mike and Nur and delivered to the classrooms; all classes used them throughout the week in math and biology lessons

5. Reports:

- a. Vice Principal Elyssa
 - New Roberts Annex School
 - Had a visioning meeting with school district and architects for new Roberts Annex school
 - Discussed what parents, teachers, and community wanted to see at the new school
 - Preliminary sketches were presented; it is expected to be multilevel with a daycare on site
 - Remembrance Day Assembly
 - School had a virtual assembly where students sang songs and recited poems
 - CSL Meetings
 - Families had their CSL meetings with teachers (one of at least five points of contact for the school year)
 - Indigenous Focus Day

- Theme was future visioning; focus is on Truth and Reconciliation Commission's calls to action
- Winter Break
 - Sent out a letter to families about out-of-country trips (children will need to stay home for 14 days after returning)
- Winter Fun Events
 - There will be singing outside, creating art, theme days
 - Many different ways to celebrate winter; feel free to share what you are doing in your home
- Tree that fell down
 - The tree that fell down in the playground area during the wind storm was unexpected
 - No staff or students were harmed
 - Staff did an amazing job making sure students went inside the school quickly
 - Groundspeople from the district were at the school within 20 minutes to assess the damage and playground; came back the next day to remove the tree; they gave the school a slice of the tree so that students can use it as a learning opportunity
 - All other trees at the school have been assessed
 - Carol spent time going to each class to talk about unexpected events, and to let the students share their thoughts
 - Some classes have started a weather unit where they learn about weather predictions and reporting
 - Questions from families:
 - 1. How often are trees assessed? Answer: They are regularly assessed. Each tree has a tag that indicates it has been assessed.
 - 2. What are the emergency procedures for the school? Answer: For extreme weather, there are school closure plans. Weather is site-specific due to regional differences – staff on site make decision around these events. The process for these events is to call a hold-and-secure (which is what occurred here).
 - 3. If any families have further questions, they can contact Elyssa
 - Question from Robin:
 - 1. If there is a weather warning, is there a threshold speed for winds that would deem them unsafe? Other things were flying around during the time the tree fell (branches, patio furniture). Answer: Weather events will be assessed on a case-by-case basis, since it is difficult to predict. As a community, we can remind families about weather, especially before walking to/from school.
- Code of Conduct
 - Staff have been working on a code of conduct based on the Circle of Courage (by Martin Brokenleg)
 - There are four points in the Circle of Courage: generosity, independence, belonging, and mastery

- Staff and students will be working together to put these four points into the student's words and actions
- Input from parents about these goals is welcome
- b. Teacher Shelagh
 - Not on call; will defer to next meeting
- c. Fundraising Cathy
 - Direct Appeal: Total number of donations was \$5365, which exceeded our goal of \$5000!
 - Winter Plant Sale: No plant sales this year, since we just finished Direct Appeal and will be starting Winter Chocolates soon
 - Winter Chocolate Fundraiser: Campaign will run from November 15th to November 24th
 - Suggestion by Nur to remind parents of ongoing fundraisers (Mabel's Labels, COBS bread); can compile list and send an email
- d. Budget Nur
 - Mabel's Labels cheque was received and deposited
 - Pumpkin costs were reimbursed to Mike and Nur
 - Teachers received \$2500; other wish list items can be funded (including school iPad, which will be used to take school pictures)
 - Will need to get more information from teachers about the drama program (this will be funded by the gaming grant)
 - Gaming grant funds have been submitted for next year
- e. Hot Lunch Michael
 - Phases
 - 1st Phase: Visioning and awareness of Hot Lunch Days
 - 2nd Phase: Hot Lunch Trial (one Hot Lunch Day)
 - 3rd Phase: Add Additional Hot Lunch Day
 - 4th Phase: Add Pizza Day
 - 5th Phase: New School Year Planning
 - Vendor: C'est Mon Café (<u>http://www.cestmoncafe.com</u>); full ordering details and FAQs are on their website
 - First day of trial: Thursday November 25th, remaining trial dates will be on Thursdays
 - Deadline for ordering: the day before the lunch day (families can order for the rest of the calendar year)
 - Cost per meal: \$6.50 (\$0.99 will go to the PAC for fundraising)
 - Families who want to participate and need financial help can contact Elyssa
 - No utensils will be provided, so students will need to bring their own; Michael has source compostable utensils (\$27.00) that will be kept at the school in case they are needed
 - Will work with Enwei to get the Hot Lunch information up on the website and send an email to families; will also post Hot Lunch posters at the school
 - Michael will be volunteering to facilitate deliveries
 - Elyssa and teachers are aware of the Phase 2 trial, and that it will increase as appropriate

- Would like PAC, parent, and teacher feedback on how the trial is going for the next PAC meeting
- Proceed to Phase 2 trial (1 meal a week, \$6.50/meal): M/S/C
- 6. New Business
 - a. Treasurer Position Mike/Nur
 - Nur is leaving this is her last week as Treasurer
 - Calls were made for nominations to fill the Treasurer position
 - Only one candidate was presented (Ray Wang)
 - Ray Wang is now the Treasurer by acclamation
 - Looking for a Co-Treasurer since Ray will be leaving next year
 - b. In-Person Events Mike
 - VSB says events are possible, but there are restrictions; need to start small and develop confidence in the school community
 - If anyone has ideas for events, please let us know
 - c. PAC Meeting Reminder
 - Mike/Enwei will send out a PAC meeting email reminder the day of the meeting
