


Not Returning to Tennyson for 2019/2020?

the “dream playground” feedback sheets that have gone out for both students and whole families to provide some initial input (please don’t forget to send yours back!).




Community Schools Team Opportunities for Students – Spring Programs


Sport and Art Together will run April 18 - June 6 in the gym and room 005 for grades 2-5.

Classroom Happenings

Divisions 1 & 3 Learn about Wind Turbines

Division 1 and 3 were lucky to receive FREE full-day workshops on Tuesday and Wednesday regarding renewable and non-renewable energy from Relay Education, a non-profit and charitable Vancouver based organization. The workshops were linked to our study of the different types of energy production studied in Term 1. During the workshop, students worked with parallel and series circuits, energy balls to determine what objects are conductors and which are isolators; and pre-assembled wind turbines with a variety of blades sizes having hypothesized prior to their experiments which would produce more energy. As a final activity, students were given a group design challenge where they were tasked with building their own turbines to see who could produce the most energy. Students had lot of fun adapting and changing their designs in order to get the highest reading on their digital multimeters. A huge thank you to Katrina, the instructor from Relay Education for allowing our students to experience these amazing hands-on activities!



Division 16 Learns about Community and Creates a Model Neighbourhood

The grade one students of Division 16 recently engaged in learning about community through a collaborative project! They worked together to create a 3-D model of a community, with each students contributing both to the ideas, as well as creating buildings, roads, or other aspects of design. 




