Curriculum Implementation Day

January 29th was a Curriculum Implementation Day at all VSB schools. You may know that schools across the province are working to implement a redesigned curriculum, in which content areas are addressed around the building of core competencies in students. Here is a description of core competencies (from the Ministry of Education website):

The core competencies along with literacy and numeracy foundations and essential content and concepts are at the centre of the redesign of curriculum and assessment. Core competencies are sets of intellectual, personal, and social and emotional proficiencies that all students need to develop in order to engage in deep learning and life-long learning.

Communication -The communication competency encompasses the set of abilities that students use to impart and exchange information, experiences and ideas, to explore the world around them, and to understand and effectively engage in the use of digital media.

Thinking - The thinking competency encompasses the knowledge, skills and processes we associate with intellectual development. It is through their competency as thinkers that students take subject-specific concepts and content and transform them into a new understanding. Thinking competence includes specific thinking skills as well as habits of mind, and metacognitive awareness.

Personal and Social - Personal and social competency is the set of abilities that relate to students' identity in the world, both as individuals and as members of their community and society. Personal and social competency encompasses the abilities students need to thrive as individuals, to understand and care about themselves and others, and to find and achieve their purposes in the world.

Our Grade 7 students are heading to Laval, Quebec (Laval is located just outside of Montreal). The students and staff chaperone team depart on February 1st and return on February 8th. They will experience many exciting activities with our host school, and with their twins and twins' families. This will include excursions that will develop French language skills, appreciation for regional culture and local history, as well as meeting many new people. Supervision of Students Before and After School

We encourage students to arrive at school on-time and ready for learning. We have staff who are on the grounds from 8:45 to 9:00 am and from 3pm to 3:15pm each day, providing supervision. We do not have supervision inside the school outside of our 9am-3pm school day. For this reason, we ask that all students remain outside the building in the morning prior to 9am, unless in the out of school care program or under direct, pre-arranged supervision of a staff member, organized extra-curricular activity etc. We are also asking students to head outside at the 3pm bell, and not to remain in the building, including in the basements. While we love to welcome students and to say "bonjour" in the halls, it is important that students are supervised. As well, staff members on all floors of the building are working on preparing lessons, engaging in assessments, collaborating with colleagues, and doing other important endeavours that require their focus and attention.
