### \*UPDATE\* Tennyson 2020 - Construction is underway!

We are excited that the construction of our new site is underway. Many students have been enjoying watching the process unfold.

We continue to strongly recommend that families avoid driving on 10<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> from Cypress to Maple, and to avoid the intersections of 11<sup>th</sup>/Maple and 10<sup>th</sup>/Maple (both driving and walking). Taking a few extra minutes to walk on streets avoiding those intersections is a good idea. Please note that the sidewalk along the field on 11<sup>th</sup> from the yellow portable to Maple St is closed, and will remain closed for the duration of the project; this is because the space is needed for trucks turning. We ask students/families NOT to walk along the south side of 11<sup>th</sup> and cross in the middle of the street; please walk all the way to Cypress/11<sup>th</sup> to cross, or avoid 11<sup>th</sup> altogether (this is ideal).

The Vancouver School District is offering you the opportunity to voluntarily purchase student accident insurance through the Kids Plus™ Accident Insurance program, underwritten by Industrial Alliance Insurance and Financial Services Inc. (iA Financial Group).

Kids Plus™ Accident Insurance provides protection against unexpected costs arising from accidental injuries. The program is especially valuable for families who:

- do not have medical or dental plans,
- have limited plans, as it may help supplement health and dental benefits, or
- have active children who enjoy sports and outdoor activities.

Kids Plus™ Accident Insurance has a selection of plans to suit most budgets. Benefits include coverage for:

- The full school year (September to September), 24 hours a day, while at home and in school;
- Expenses that are often limited or not covered by private or group insurance plans, or Provincial Health Insurance Plans, such as ambulance, physiotherapy, private tutoring, counselling, and much more;
- Injury-related dental treatment (including future dental treatment up to age 26);
- Out-of-province or country emergency medical expenses.

If your address changes during the school year, your Kids Plus™ Accident Insurance plan is transferable from school to school, anywhere in Canada. ## Saving Natural Gas at School

## Why do we need to save Natural Gas?

On October 9, 2018, a natural gas pipeline burst near Prince George, BC. Until the line can be fixed, natural gas supply to the whole province is limited.

Everyone in BC has been asked to cut back on using natural gas until the repair is complete. Some companies have even shut down temporarily, meaning many people have been laid off.

The VSB uses natural gas to heat our schools and offices, so we need to reduce our use. Let's do our part to share BC's limited natural gas supply!

### How can I help?



**Turn down the heat.** If your classroom has an adjustable thermostat, please keep it set to 20°C whenever possible.



**Dress warmly.** Since the heat will be lowered at school, make sure to dress for the weather. Make it fun by having "sweater" or "toque" days at your school!



**Keep the heat in - close the doors.** During lunch and recess, please don't prop any doors open. It wastes heat (and gas!).



**Keep the heat in - close the windows.** Fresh air is nice, but cold air takes a lot of gas to heat up. Whenever possible, keep windows closed during class, and always closed in an empty room.

# Saving Natural Gas at Home

### Why do we need to save Natural Gas at home?

On October 9, 2018, a natural gas pipeline burst near Prince George, BC. Until the line can be fixed, natural gas supply to the whole province is limited.

Everyone in BC has been asked to cut back on using natural gas, even at home, until the repair is complete. Some companies have even shut down temporarily, meaning many people have been laid off.

Many Vancouver homes use natural gas to heat and power their homes. Let's do our part to share BC's limited natural gas supply!

### How can I help?



**Turn down the heat.** Keep your thermostat set below or at 20°C whenever possible.



**Dress warmly.** Stay cozy at home with sweaters, socks, long pants, and blankets.



**Heat only the rooms you're in.** It's a waste of gas to heat rooms and spaces that aren't being used. Close registers and turn off baseboard heaters in empty rooms and storage spaces.



**Take shorter showers.** Natural gas heats our hot water. Limit showers to 5 minutes whenever possible.



**Maximize your dishwasher.** Natural gas heats our hot water. Only run the dishwasher when it's a full load, and try the energy-saving mode for less dirty dishes.



**Maximize your laundry.** Natural gas heats our hot water. Use cold water to wash laundry, and always wash full loads. If you have a natural gas dryer, use low heat settings, like "permanent press," or better yet, hang clothes to dry when possible.
