UPDATE Tennyson 2020 - Construction is about to begin!

We received word this afternoon that DGS construction will be starting tomorrow to create the entry and exits for the site, including bringing in gravel and some trucks. The field is now needed. Today some traffic flagger signs were placed on the surrounding roads. Many students are excited to begin watching the construction process!

As construction begins, we are strongly recommending that families avoid driving on 10th and 11th from Cypress to Maple, and to avoid the intersections of 11th/Maple and 10th/Maple (both driving and walking). Taking a few extra minutes to walk on streets avoiding those intersections is a good idea.

We will soon be receiving the final drawings for the new building and the grounds. We will be showing these to parents at the October 22nd PAC meeting at 7pm. We will then post these on our Tennyson 2020 wall in front of the office, and to our website. Any minor changes to building design from the plans that were originally presented to the PAC and community have been discussed at PAC in 2017-18.

Again, we really appreciate the support of our incredible parent community as we work with our changing spaces, and are excited about our new future campus!

Emergency Awareness, Procedures, and Practices – Fire Drills, Lockdowns, Earthquake Drills

We always hope that emergency situations do not occur, but we know that it is important to be prepared in case one does. All schools practice these procedures. For example, we do regular fire drill practices in which everyone in the building evacuates, attendance is taken, and we look at the time it takes to exit the building and the manner in which we do so, with an eye to improve if needed. We also practice a "lockdown" which is a procedure used in the unlikely event that there is an intruder in the school. When the "lockdown" announcement is made, staff members quickly bring anyone in the hall into classrooms and doors are closed and locked. Phones or technology that make noise are turned off, and students go to the safest place in the room. We practice these several times each year. **We had a successful Fire Drill today and we will have a lockdown drill on October 16th.**

Tennyson 2020 Committee is looking for Volunteers!

Did you know that there is a PAC-sponsored committee that liaises with our admin team and staff regarding construction of our new school and grounds? The role of this committee is to work together to solve challenges, to lend a hand when help is needed, and to liaise with the PAC on future spending in regards to the new buildings. Some examples of things that the committee might engage in: helping to create play/social opportunities for students when the footprint of our site is temporarily reduced (eg. help the school to build a bank of art supplies and games, sandboxes etc.), study options for new playgrounds, and discuss with staff options for technology, specialized items, and other "things" for the new building, both at initial occupancy and to establish plans for the future. 
Lunchtime – Eating and Recycling/Composting

Students read the story of Phyllis Webstad, who is Northern Secwpemc (Shuswap) from the Stswecem'c Xgat'tem First Nation, and now lives in Williams' Lake, BC. In her story, she talks about her experiences as a child in the residential school system, and how this affected her cultural and personal identity as someone of indigenous ancestry. Students learned about reconciliation and were very much touched by her story. They then wrote letters to Phyllis in appreciation of her sharing her story.
