- Shadowing a student an innovative learning opportunity for senior leadership, and educators to better understand what is most important to students.
- The Dec 9<sup>th</sup> renaming ceremony for Sir Matthew Begbie Elementary. The school was gifted with a həndəminəm name at a special renaming ceremony hosted by the Musqueam Indian Band. The new school name, wəkwanəs tə syaqwəm means "sun rising over the horizon".

# **AUDIT COMMITTEE**

Monday, February 13, 2023

#### Committee Report to the Board, February 27, 2023

The Chairperson of the Committee called the meeting to order and acknowledged we are unlearning and relearning on the traditional and unceded lands of the x<sup>w</sup>məθk<sup>w</sup>əyʻəm (Musqueam), Skwxwú7mesh (Squamish) and səlilwəta<del>l</del> (Tsleil-Waututh) Nations and reviewed meeting decorum.

A master PowerPoint presentation detailing the flow of the agenda was shown throughout the meeting, a copy of which is on file with the meeting agenda.

#### 1. Oversight Role of the Auditor General

The Secretary Treasurer presented a report dated February 13, 2023 entitled *Oversight Role of the Auditor General*. The report provides information on the role and responsibility of the Auditor General of the Province of British Columbia in auditing all entities in the Province, including school districts that make up the Government Reporting Entity (GRE). He referred to a PowerPoint slide, entitled *Auditor General Oversight Role* and noted that the Auditor General (AG) is responsible for the following:

- Auditing government ministries with private sector firms responsible for auditing most of the other entities in the GRE.
- Producing a rolling three-year Audit Coverage Plan in which select districts are chosen as oversight entities.

He further reported that the Auditor General had acted as the Vancouver School Board's auditor from 2015-2016 to 2019-2020, and that KPMG assumed the auditor role in 2020-2021. In September 2020, the AG indicated that they would conduct oversight procedures starting in the year ending June 30, 2023 for a minimum of two years. The AG has now informed staff that the oversight role has become continuing, given the District is a significant component of the summary financial statements. He concluded his presentation by informing committee members that representatives of the Office of the Auditor General are expected to attend the next Audit Committee Meeting in April 2023.

Committee members asked questions and staff provided clarification on various points.

Committee member, and external consultant, Farnaz Riahi joined the meeting at 7:08pm.

#### 2. Asset Retirement Obligation Update

The Secretary Treasurer presented a report dated February 13, 2023 entitled **Asset Retirement Obligation Update.** The report includes information on the new accounting standard, PS3280





Asset Retirement Obligation (ARO), approved by the Public Sector Accounting Board (PSAB) in March 2018, and is effective for public sector entities starting in fiscal year April 1, 2022.

He provided the Committee with background on the ARO, referring to PowerPoint slides to explain the following:

- The definition of the ARO, as a legal obligation associated with the retirement of a tangible capital asset.
- The recognition of an ARO Liability, and costs excluded from the ARO.
- Asset retirement obligations for school districts often include asbestos, lead in paint and underground storage tanks.

The Assistant Secretary-Treasurer spoke to the obligations and estimated costs in the report. He noted that staff used current rates based on experience to form the cost estimates, and that the VSB's external auditor, KPMG was in agreement with this approach.

He concluded the presentation by reviewing the Board's liability and discussing next steps in the process.

Committee members asked questions and staff provided clarification on various points.

#### 3. Update on 2019-2020 Auditor's Management Letter

The Assistant Secretary-Treasurer presented a report dated February 13, 2023, entitled *Update on 2019-2020 Auditor's Management Letter.* He explained the purpose of the Auditor's Management Letter and provided an update on the management letter points raised by the Office of the Auditor General (OAG) during the 2019-2020 Audit. He noted that no new recommendations were identified following KPMG's 2021 and 2022 Audits and reported that the remaining three unresolved findings presented at the February 16, 2022 Audit Committee Meeting have since been resolved.

Committee members asked questions and staff provided clarification on various points.

This report was provided for information.

#### 4. <u>Enterprise Risk Management (ERM) Project Status Update</u>

The Director of Risk Management and Privacy Compliance presented a report dated February 13, 2023 entitled *Enterprise Risk Management (ERM) Project Status Update*. He provided an overview of Enterprise Risk Management since 2017 when the Ministry requested all school districts implement an EMR program to help identify, and manage risks over time. He outlined the steps the District is taking towards developing an ERM Program including engaging KPMG in 2017/2018 to conduct an EMR Assessment and to help build a framework, and in 2021 reengaging KPMG to lead the refresh of the District Enterprise Risks. He reported that KPMG





conducted twenty-two interviews with various members of District staff. Following the interviews, twenty new risks were identified, ranked and included in the official District risk register. He reviewed the status of work currently underway and noted that part of the work moving forward will include the development of a risk appetite statement involving the Board of Education and Senior Management

Committee members asked questions and staff provided clarification on various points. In response to a committee member's question about new potential risks associated with Artificial Intelligence (AI), staff noted that new risks were added since the 2021 refresh and that new risks will be added as they emerge.

This report was provided for information.

That staff review the current naming and renaming process and provide information and a recommendation as to possible changes to current Board Policy to articulate the Board's vision and values in relation to naming and renaming school facilities, to clearly establish the role of the Board in the naming and renaming process and to provide guidance as to the number of naming and renaming processes that will be undertaken at any given time. Staff will report this information and recommendation to Policy and Governance Committee for input and feedback no later than July 2023.

#### **RATIONALE**

The VSB Policy Handbook has been identified as lacking with respect to the naming and renaming of schools and facilities, given the significance of naming and renaming decisions and the amount of staff time required in each naming/renaming process. Several naming and renaming processes have commenced this school year, which has taken up a significant amount of staff resources, potentially pulling them away from executing on the Board's Education Plan.





The Renaming Existing School Facilities administrative procedure does not delineate the scope of Committee or Board members to engage which further draws down on limited staff time. Given that each application undergoes an extensive committee and public review processes involving Committee members, there should be a reasonable expectation in any school year as to the number of applications that should be undertaken.

The Board needs to provide guidance and direction and play a more active role in the naming and renaming process. Given the significant implications of naming and renaming, the Board should clearly outline the goal of renaming facilities and the Board's vision and values and how they relate to renaming.

The Board policy should reflect ongoing engagement and collaboration with the Musqueam, Squamish and Tsleil-Waututh Nations in developing a shared understanding and protocol for the Board to follow when seeking an Indigenous land-based name for a school community.

As a new incoming Board we have a responsibility, given the magnitude of naming and renaming decisions, to allocate sufficient time to carefully and thoughtfully examine our processes and policy guidelines for this important work.


