### **GRADE K INFORATION 2020-2021**

We are very excited to have your child start Kindergarten in September! Due to unexpected events with COVID, we will not be able to provide you a concise schedule for your child's gradual entry into Kindergarten. We hope to have specific information regarding school towards the end of August. At this time, we do not have any direction from the Ministry of Education and The Vancouver School Board of Education as to whether learning will be at home or having students come to school. As information does change, we will surely communicate this to you in the most timely manner as possible.

\*\*We would like all families to note that typical gradual entry in Kindergarten takes approximately 1 ½ weeks. This means that your child will not be attending school full time until at least the second week into the school year. (On or around September 16)

The Ministry of Education has sent us a document that we have sent out to you via email. It is called "When I go to Kindergarten". You can use this document to find information on how to support your child's transition into Kindergarten. Feel free to use some or all of the activities in it to help prepare a successful start to their school year.

We hope you have a restful and peaceful summer. We look forward to working with your child here at Van Horne as they begin their learning journey.

# 2020 – 2021 SCHOOL FEES

#### General \$35.00 School Fee

The Vancouver School Board offers the service of purchasing basic school supplies in bulk at wholesale prices and passing the cost savings on to families. The School Supply Fee for 2020 – 2021 is \$35.00 per student\*.

This fee covers basic consumable school supplies used for students' personal use such as paper, writing tools, glue sticks, erasers, exercise books and art supplies. Supplies are provided for the full year.

\*The General Supply Fee of \$35 is an increase to the fee from previous years and reflects increases in current costs.



#### Student Agenda/Planner – \$7.00

Students at Sir William Van Horne will be using an Agenda/Planner in grades 1-7. School agendas/planners are a valuable tool for teaching children how to organize and plan for school. While students are not required to have an agenda/planner it is designed to assist students with the skills of organization and time management and is a very useful communication tool often used between teachers and families.

#### Activity Fee – \$5.00 to \$8.00

Some classes will be offering various activities that require some supplemental fees. Examples include Div. 1 asking for \$8 to cover drama costs and Kindergarten classes asking for \$5 to cover cooking supplies.

#### Grade 7 Camp – approx. \$90

This year we will be offering camp opportunities for some or all grade 7 classes. Exact costs will be determined at a later date.

#### Workbooks – approx. \$20

This year, students in some division(s) will be bringing home a math or vocabulary Practice and Homework Book. This material supplements the classroom math program. The workbook is available for purchase at the cost of approx.. \$20.00. Students are not obligated to purchase the workbook, and may opt to use their copy as a reference textbook instead, meaning the workbook will be returned at the end of the school year for another student to use in the future. Students opting to use the workbook as a textbook will be responsible for ensuring that it remains unmarked and in excellent condition in order to return the workbook at the end of the year.

#### Performances - \$10

There may be performances at the school throughout the year.

Field Studies - To be determined throughout the school year at the classroom level

Throughout the school year your child's teacher may plan supplementary learning opportunities at locations outside of the school and request monies towards entrance fees, transportation or equipment rental. Your child's teacher will communicate this information to you directly.

#### **FINANCIAL HARDSHIP**

As a reminder, the Vancouver School Board will not deny a child access to the school supplies required for his or her educational program because of financial hardship. Nor will any child be excluded from activities where a fee is charged. If at any time there is a financial challenge, please contact the school Principal, (insert name).
